Milestones



On Saturday, April 19, 2008, the doors were finally opened to the Lewis Library and Technology Center among a great deal of excitement and fanfare. An estimated ten thousand people lined up to be among the first to discover the nearly limitless treasures within.

While we have all been involved – the Fontana Library Foundation and all the generous donors and supporters – with the Lewis Library and Technology Center project from the literal “ground-up”, the finished facility has surpassed everyone’s imagination. The Library building is more beautiful than one could have dreamt, and in every corner there is a new educational activity in which to engage. Clearly, this \$65 million public library is, as Fontana’s Mayor Nuaimi has called it, “the jewel” of the City’s downtown.

While the total price tag was more than \$65 million, it is really the \$15.6 million in private donations and pledges from the ambitious Fontana Library Foundation capital campaign of which we should all be most proud. The capital funds raised through the public campaign truly symbolize our community’s philanthropic spirit and commitment to the education of our region.

In appreciation of the Lewis Group of Companies’ generous contribution of \$5 million to the campaign fund, the Library will be known as the Lewis Library and Technology Center for perpetuity. Other generous donors include the City of Fontana, Reggie King from Young Homes, David Wiener, the Mayor’s Gala Committee 2006-2008, Ryland Homes-Southern California Division, San Bernardino County Supervisor Josie Gonzales, and San Bernardino County Supervisor Paul Biane. In total, the capital campaign attracted over 600 donors.

Other than the Grand Opening, a number of both fundraising and celebratory events were held this last year. On Saturday, April 12, six hundred party-goers attended the black-tie, 6th Annual Mayor’s Gala to hear Mayor Nuaimi’s State of the City Address and get a first look at the Library. The evening had a “Novel Production” theme and also included a VIP Reception for the Library’s largest donors.

The Second Annual Golf Classic was sponsored by the Fontana Community Foundation on June 16 to benefit the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Children’s Library. Like last year’s tournament, the 2008 Golf Classic was presented by Fontana Mayor Pro Tem Acquanetta Warren and the tournament Chairman was Greg Bell, former NFL Rams and Raiders all pro running back and founder of Athletics for Life, a non-profit organization to provide student athletes with the knowledge and the tools to become productive citizens.

On June 21, the official dedication ceremony for the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Children’s Library was held, and all generous sponsors and donors for the Children’s Library were recognized. Since this year marked the fortieth anniversary of Dr. King’s death, the dedication of this Children’s Library named in his honor was especially poignant.

VIP Reception



Before opening the doors to the public and beginning a new chapter in the exciting story of the new Library, the Fontana Library Foundation wanted to take one last time to celebrate – in style! Thus, immediately prior to the Mayor’s Gala on Saturday, April 12, this invitation only VIP Reception

was held to celebrate the story’s heroes and heroines - the Library’s generous donors and supporters. With gourmet seafood delights and champagne, the Library’s greatest fans were treated to a little pampering of their own.

6th Annual Mayor’s Gala



The 6th Annual Mayor’s Gala was held on Saturday, April 12. With over 600 in attendance, the “A Novel Production” themed event was a definite success. The Mayor delivered the State of the City Address in the brand new Steelworkers’ Auditorium, and was then able to lead the crowds into the Library for the first glimpses and tours of the amazing facility. Guests dined, danced and lost themselves among the Library’s attractions.

Grand Opening

The Grand Opening for the Lewis Library and Technology Center was held on Saturday, April 18. Despite the warm day, ten thousand people gathered together to be the first to walk through its doors and to celebrate the historic occasion. Mark Nuaimi, Mayor of the City of Fontana, served as master of ceremonies for the grand opening event. He thanked the key donors and supporters involved in the project. At the forefront of his gratitude was the Lewis Group of Companies, for whom the library is named.



Once the symbolic red ribbons were cut, grand opening attendees flooded into the library to sign up for library cards and explore the auditorium; career center; over 100,000 material items; 200 public use computers, coffee bar, and NASCAR themed teen area.

Golf Tournament

In an effort to raise funds and name the children’s section of the Lewis Library and Technology Center in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Mayor Pro Tem Acquanetta Warren, organized a golf classic in conjunction with the Fontana Community Foundation. The first golf



classic to benefit the Children’s Library cause was held in June, 2007. This year, on Monday, June 16, the Second Annual Golf Classic was held. Once again, Mayor Pro Tem Warren organized the event and recruited Greg Bell, former NFL all-pro running back, to serve as Chairman of the event. In total, close to \$1 million was raised for resources and materials for the new Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Children’s Library.

Children’s Library Dedication

On Saturday, June 21, the children’s section of the Lewis Library and Technology Center was dedicated in memory of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. At the dedication ceremony, the sculpture of the civil rights leader was unveiled in which King is depicted on top of a stack of books – Aristotle, Plato, Gandhi, Thoreau and the Bible – believed to have influenced his life’s work.
